#### **Programme of work**

#### Surveying

Between 6 and 14 June 2023, Yonder oversaw a survey of 187 residents (16+) interviewed in person across the wards of Millom and Millom Without. The interviews were conducted by Red Research, on behalf of Yonder.

Quotas and weights were employed to ensure a demographically representative sample of the area's adult (16+) population.

#### Accounting for the change to the Search Area

The Search Area for South Copeland changed its boundary due to Local Government Reorganisation. The South Copeland Search Area now covers the electoral division of Millom and Millom Without. Drigg and Carleton, and Irton with Santon, which were previously part of the Mid Copeland Search Area are now part of the South Copeland Search Area. This addition increased the population by c.700 residents. By recording respondents' parish council, data from the former Search Area could be compared with the revised Search Area.

#### **Depth interviews**

Yonder conducted ten depth interviews with residents from across the wards Millom and Millom Without.


Each interview utilised a flexible discussion guide. Interviews were conducted over the phone and lasted approximately 30 minutes.

Each interview was moderated by an experienced Yonder researcher.

### Awareness and understanding

## 57% recalled seeing, reading, or hearing something in the past year. Two-in-five (42%) attributed their awareness to a leaflet or newsletter



Q. I would now like to show you the front page of the South Copeland GDF Community Partnership Newsletter. Do you recall seeing and/or reading this in the last year?






## Awareness of the Community Partnership and the South Copeland Search Area had decreased since 2022



# 37% of respondents were aware of the UK's current storage method, though 35% admitted they were not sure


Q. What best describes your understanding of how the UK currently manages, stores or disposes of its radioactive waste?





It buries it deep at sea





## One-in-five (19%) were able to identify the accurate description of a GDF






## Geological disposal

# 39% supported a GDF in the South Copeland Search Area, whilst 27% opposed it. One-in-three were neutral. NET support stood at +11



Q. What kind of information would you like to receive regarding geological disposal and the siting process?\*





# Participants wanted to receive more information through local events, online forums, postal information, and social media platforms





"Do local forums, advertising. Say we'll be here on such and such a date. If you are interested, if you want any questions answered, please come."

"The best way to do something like that is through the web."

"Not everybody's got computers. A lot of old people live here as well. Just put [it] through the letter box."

"Probably through the post would be the best because then people can take it in at their own speed, their own pace."


"Post, social media."

#### Interviewees emphasised the importance of hearing from experts

Q. What kinds of organisations or people would you like to hear from regarding geological disposal and the siting process?\*





"If you listen to somebody who works at Sellafield, especially in the offices, they know what they're talking about."

"I don't put much faith in the government. It would be Sellafield and any company that stores the nuclear waste for them."

"People from Sellafield and hopefully, I could trust the government, but they lie as well."

"Sellafield PLC. They're used to it, they've done it for many years, so, they're probably the world leaders."

"Independent people who know everything there is to know about the nuclear industry."

## **Appendix**

#### Methodology

#### **Survey methodology**

Between 6 and 14 June 2023, Yonder oversaw a survey of 187 residents (16+) interviewed in person across the wards of Millom and Millom Without. The interviews were conducted by Red Research, on behalf of Yonder.

Quotas were employed to ensure the resident sample was representative of the relative populations of the two wards. Weighting was then employed to ensure the sample was representative in terms of the age and sex profile of the population in question.

With a sample of 187 and a 95% confidence interval, a margin of error of +/-7% is expected (though confidence intervals do vary depending on the values involved).

#### **Qualitative methodology**

Between 21 July and 17 June, Yonder conducted ten depth interviews with residents from across the wards Millom and Millom Without.

Each interview utilised a flexible discussion guide that covered: knowledge of the current approach to radioactive waste management, views of geological disposal, awareness of the South Copeland Community Partnership and preferences for how the Community Partnership communicates with the local community.

Interviews were conducted over the phone and lasted approximately 30 minutes. Each interview was moderated by an experienced Yonder researcher.
